Board introduced themselves. We then went around and each introduced themselves, as well as the kiddos they have at the school.

Approval of Minutes:

Minutes from the May 16, 2023 meeting were approved (montined by Holly Blough; Stephanie Shepard seconds) and are on the Kettle Lake website.

Updates from the principal:

Magan has 365 students this year! Using money from the first bond as we want! Getting a lot of new furniture. They got 500/600 NEW chairs delivered (during the school day!) - good chaos. She brought them in for us to see. Also receiving all new desks - those will be delivered by desk fairies overnight to each room. Also receiving new gaga pits, blinds, shelving, AND new teacher chairs. It's been a ton of work, but lots of fun. Excited to show off new stuff - hoping for all to be in by Halloween parties.

It's been a great start to the year. One new classroom teacher, but she's not an entirely new face - she is a Kettle Lake parent. Also welcomed one new parapro. There are lots of new kiddos, with first grade welcoming the most new students this year.

Megan welcomed the 2nd grade teachers. They are an amazing team; work absolutely awesome together. They are a fun team and are so in sync in all they do.

School Staff - 2nd Grade:

Something they have added this year is optional homework, which they are calling life skills. They have noticed, even as parents themselves, kids aren't always prepared with certain life skills that they may have just not been exposed to. So they are adding in this "homework" that includes skills ranging from writing full name (including middle), mopping/sweeping, making bed, knowing an emergency number, etc. If they complete they get their name on a board - no major prize, but recognition for a job well done.

Budget (Stephanie Shepard):

Stephanie handed out the past budget and walked through a few items. Highlighted that the office activity fund was over only due to not having all expenses in (like yearbooks for staff) before the lounge project was calculated, but there was plenty of room in the overall budget. Other

bussing, which is used when we bus from Lakeside, was over budget so will be increased. Overall, we came out ahead.

We then looked at the 2023/2024 budget, which was made using prior year as a guide and making adjustments based on actual as well as some known/discussed changes.

Expense Only Items to highlight:

- Reading month can use assemblies again this year, as we do want to bring in an author/illustrator and there are no other assemblies planned.
- Classroom Supplies budget was updated to be sure to include all needed with Megans input. Main change from last year was to add in an "Itinerants" line, which will be used for all special education staff; she feels this will better suffice. There was also discussion about the Peer to Peer Links program. This is a side by side mentor type relationship for the special education program right in the school-kids help kids. Students will play games, crafts, etc. This program is run by Mrs. Torres and these items were often funded by her personally. We would like to add a line item for this program going forward will vote.
- Asked teachers if they were good with the amount provided by the PTO. Resounding yes, they get school funds as well.

Walk through of Revenue generating items:

- We have removed some programs that are no longer running/we aren't using - Box Tops, Amazon Smile, Direct Your Dollars.
- Of course, our main event and largest fundraiser is Walk-A-Thon goal of \$20,000 this year in budget.
- Also increased Family Fun night goal to \$6,000 (from \$5,000 last year);
 this is still less than actually earned last year!

The budget was motioned for approval by Kelli Bonnell; Amanda Theisen seconds.

Amanda Theisen motioned to add in the \$300 for the discussed Peer to Peer Links program; Jessica Reidl seconds.

Committee Reports:

 □ Walk-A-Thon: Christy Morehouse, Amanda Theisen (Jessica Reidl) □ Using 99 pledges this year - each kiddo will have their own link
for electronic donations. Program is user friendly (Megan has tested as well and loves it). You easily search by student name (first and/or last) and will be sorted by class. Teachers can
track and make a competition if they'd like. Christy has set a goal of \$2,000 per classroom, which gives us a reach goal of \$30,000!
Team will go in on the day of the Walk-A-Thank and count/assign cash and checks, which will still be accepted.
Amanda notes that there are no shirts for prizes, which makes things standard and much easier. Prizes will just be magically delivered to lockers based on level earned.
